### **2024 Renewal Changes**

- Renewal will be age banded (5-year age bands) based on average age of the group. The rates will be composite rated, the same as in 2023.
- Limit to groups of 50 employees or less. Groups currently enrolled with over 50 employees will be grandfathered and can remain.
- Underwriting process BCBSKS will review the risk of groups

   if the risk of the group is within 10% of the risk of the
   association, they will be accepted, if the risk is higher, they will
   be denied.
- Groups with 10 or more employees will complete the census.
- Groups with 9 or fewer employees will complete health **profiles**.

The positive atmosphere fostered a sense of unity and cooperation among the attendees, reinforcing the spirit of community engagement and cultural appreciation.
