



United Way Update from the Executive Director

Barton & Pawnee Counties have a strong focus on children and families. United Way of Central Kansas is a great fit with this mindset because of their focus on childhood literacy and bringing people together for a common goal. One of the biggest goals is to

bring Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to children in Hoisington and Great Bend. This program is currently fully funded by UWCK in Larned and Ellinwood and is loved by those in the community who receive books every month. Don't know what the Imagination Library is? The program was started by Dolly Parton in 1995 to foster a love of reading and to provide high quality, age-appropriate books to children every month, regardless of their family's income. With this program every child age 0-5 can receive a hard cover book every month for free. The book comes address directly to the child in a plastic cover and is specific to the child's age and gender.

In order for UWCK to be able to provide this program to an additional estimated 1,000 children in Barton County, we have a goal of raising \$50,000 so that we can fund the program for a minimum of 3 years. We are confident that once the communities see these books and the impact they have on childhood literacy, we can further sustain the program through donations and grants. In order to get it started though, we need the funds to make it happen. We have been working closely with clubs and organizations, including, Lions Clubs, PEO Society, Rotary, Progress Club, Optimist Club, as


well as business donors who believe this program is beneficial to our children. With the help of these clubs, we have raised over \$8,000 so far, but we still need more to get the program off the ground. We have made huge strides towards our 2017 Campaign Goal of \$275,000 to support our 23 local non-profit agencies. As of submission, we are at 95% of our goal and hope to be over 100% by the time you read this article.
