important today because the pandemic increased the number of patients diagnosed with anxiety and depression.

Stress can filter into all parts of daily life because of "financial concerns, fear of the unknown about COVID-19, loss of family and friends to the virus, job layoffs, and fewer interactions and activities outside the house," the nurse practitioner said.

According to the American Psychological Association, stress affects all bodily systems when it becomes severe or chronic.

"Your mind and body are one; our mental health significantly impacts our physical health," Holaday said. "Our bodies can withstand normal, intermittent stress. However, chronic stress can negatively impact our overall health. Stress management is just one way to help decrease the negative effects.

"Recognizing that you are struggling mentally is not a weakness," she emphasized "It is a strength that could potentially improve your overall well-being."

Most important, she added, if stress becomes so overwhelming that a patient experiences negative self-talk or thoughts of self-harm "it is vital to share this with your healthcare provider. We care about you and are here to help provide the resources and treatments that you need."

Holaday is part of the family-medicine team at the clinic and hospital.

"Mental health is a team effort," she explained. 'It is important that people understand they

pursuing her education to earn credentials as a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMH NP).

"I think of myself as a natural-born caregiver. I have a lot of personal experience with mental health and it helps me to help others," Griswold said. "I want to diminish the negative connotation of mental-health issues and let people know that, regardless of how bad things seem, they can get better.

"I want to demonstrate this by example, as well as by using my background and education."

Conditions that might benefit from treatment are as varied as the patients. In many cases, someone dealing with mentalhealth issues might benefit from medication, Griswold noted.

"People sometimes ask why I didn't become a therapist instead of a nurse practitioner who can prescribe meds," she related. "In this position, I get to do both. When a medication is warranted, therapy is the key to learning new skills to be able to function."

Therapists at The Center and local physicians sometimes refer patients to Griswold but anyone can call for an appointment.

"We have a great program that allows everyone to be seen, regardless of income or insurance status," Griswold said. "There is a sliding-fee scale so you don't have to worry about money being an obstacle to obtaining these services."

The nurse practitioner sees patients one-on-one, while also encouraging their

Even though Griswold has been at The Center only a short time, she feels welcome. "There is an overwhelming feeling of family here; everyone is so supportive. I finally feel like Lam home."

Great Bend rejoins Main Street Program

Great Bend was one of three Kansas cities to rejoin Kansas Main Street Program, which targets preservation and revitalization of downtown districts, Great Bend Economic Development Inc. President Sara Hayden said. The announcement, which also included Hays and Salina, was made Thursday afternoon at the Stiefel Theatre in Salina by Kansas Gov. Laura Kelly

According to the Kansas Department of Commerce which oversees the program, "Kansas Main Street helps communities preserve and revitalize their downtown districts by helping them develop a comprehensive strategy."

"Great Bend Economic Development recognizes that the eyes into any rural community are viewed through the downtown," Hayden said. "Our organization has worked hard throughout the last two years to make sure our downtown exemplifies the excellence we see for our city. We are pleased and excited to rejoin the Kansas Main Street program knowing that our visions and goals align and that will be able to help each other to see success in our downtown corridor."

"I am thrilled to see Great Bend rejoining the Kansas Main Street program," said Great Bend Chamber of Commerce President Megan Barfield, who was in Salina for the announcement. "We already have a beautiful and vibrant downtown and now it's time to level-up.

"It will take strong partnerships and access to robust resources like the Main Street program to keep the momentum going," Barfield said. "The Chamber saw it as a no-brainer to support the application submitted by Great Bend Economic Development."

"The Kansas Main Street network continues to grow, and it's great to see communities that were previously part of the program rejoin this year," Laura Kelly said. "Today's announcement is a sign for the future of our state's vibrant downtowns and the state's economy. It's clear the Kansas Main Street program is not only back on its feet — it's now stronger than ever."

About the program

The Kansas Main Street program, initially launched in 1985, has helped dozens of primarily rural communities work toward maintaining and enhancing the viability of their downtown districts. The program is a selfhelp technical assistance program focused on organization, design, promotion, and economic restructuring.

The Gov. Sam Brownback administration ended the program in 2012. It was restarted in 2019 by Governor Kelly with support from the Kansas Legislature.

These communities were in the program during its first 27 years of existence, and since its return, these three communities have

expressed interest in rejoining. With these three communities rejoining, the Kansas Main Street program has added ten communities in the past two years, bringing the total number of Designated communities to 35.

"Our main streets speak volumes about our state and its communities," Lieutenant **Governor and Commerce** Secretary David Toland said. "We're pleased to see three outstanding communities rejoining Kansas Main Street this year. Strong and vibrant main streets make it clear that Kansas is open for business, and we have outstanding cities and towns where people want to live and where businesses want to invest."

Since Governor Kelly announced the Affiliate program in late 2020, more than 40 Affiliate communities have gained access to resources from the state and national offices to assist in their downtown revitalization efforts. The Affiliate program helps smaller communities that may not be ready to meet the requirements of a Designated community.

The Kansas Main Street program is affiliated with the


