## Where Do Local Candidates Stand on Issues?

The local League of Women Voters of Great Bend/Barton County is active in organizing yearly candidate forums for contested races to help the community understand where candidates stand on the issues. LWV appreciates partnering with the Great Bend Senior Center on October 5 th and the Hoisington Friendship House on October 12 th to provide locations for the recent two candidate forums. Reporters from the Great Bend Tribune and the Great Bend Post have provided excellent newspaper and online coverage of these events. The GB Post provided streaming coverage of the first forum. A total of thirty candidates were invited to the two forums and eighteen were able to attend.

Those contested races included Mayors for Great Bend and Hoisington; City Council positions

for Great Bend, Hoisington, and Claflin; Board of Education positions for Great Bend, and Hoisington; and Barton Community College Trustee positions.

Since 2006 the LWV Education Fund has provided candidate and voting information on this site. The two questions that were asked of each candidate at both forums are also found here. The League encourages the candidates to respond to their online questions as soon as possible so voters can be informed before casting their ballots.

When the answers are submitted voters can view the responses <u>on www.VOTE411.org</u> Simply select "ON YOUR BALLOT" in the top right of the screen, select your state, then enter your address under "PERSONALIZED BALLOT." Then, click through each of the relevant races. As a representative democracy, we best elect our leaders after first understanding their viewpoints and platforms. Remember to vote on or before Nov. 7, 2023.

# IGNITE Rural Business Competition Grand Finale: A Night of Triumph and Celebration

The stage was set, the anticipation was palpable, and the excitement was electric as the IGNITE Rural Business Competition Grand Finale unfolded on October 5th at the iconic Crest Theater in downtown Great Bend, Kansas. This thrilling event marked the culmination of an exhilarating journey that began with the top 10 businesses competing in a semi-final round.

With 1805 total viewers tuning in to the live stream on Thursday night, igniteks.com saw an impressive 887 visitors directly to the site and an additional 1650 coming from Facebook to the site. In the last 30 days alone, there were a total of 2,565 site sessions, showcasing the widespread interest and engagement generated by the competition.

One of the highlights of the evening was the People's Choice award, which was presented to 10-39 Café. They not only earned the admiration of the audience but also an additional \$5,000, thanks to their remarkable 56% share of the votes. A total of 921 votes were cast on the Slido.com platform between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8:50 p.m.

The judges for the evening, Kari Smith, Jason Mayers, and Jerrod Westfahl, played the role of "sharks" or judges, carefully evaluating the top 5 finalists. Each finalist delivered a compelling 10-minute pitch followed by an additional 10-minute question and answer period. The judges' deliberation determined how the prize money would be awarded.

The winners of the IGNITE Rural Business Competition were announced as follows:

- 1st Place: The Greystone winning \$50,000
- 2nd Place: 10-39 Café winning \$30,000
- 3rd Place: Hatchet Axtion winning \$10,000

These businesses demonstrated outstanding innovation, dedication, and a vision for contributing to the Barton County community. The competition showcased the remarkable entrepreneurial spirit thriving in the region.

#### **Robben Finds Best of Two** Worlds at Pawnee Valley

When Julie Robben was offered the best of two worlds at Pawnee Valley Community Hospital, she jumped at the chance to fill the dual role. Robben, a Russel native, is the new director of the new PVCH Imaging Departmernt where she is a part of the leadership team, while also providing direct care to patients. "Being able to care for patients alongside this amazing team is a real bonus," Robben said. "They always have the patients' best interests at heart."



"The hospital's state-of-the-art equipment allows us to provide most of the services that are available at large facilities," she continued. "In addition, it is great having HaysMed as a resource when needed." Services offered at the Pat Young Imaging center include: general x-ray; computed tomography (CT); magnetic resonance imaging (MRI); nuclear medicine; ultrasound; mammography; bone densitometry; and pain clinic. The center is staffed by registered radiology technologists who are licensed by the state of Kansas. The staff is cross-trained in different modalities and they are all willing to further their education by working toward advanced credentials, Robben noted. Nuclear medicine and ultrasound services are staffed by HaysMed professionals.

Robben graduated in May 2006 with a bachelor of science in Medical Diagnostic Imaging. She also earned an associate of science in Radiologic Technology and is working on her Master of Professional Studies in Medical Imaging, emphasizing administration.

Robben started woring at HaysMed in 2005 as a secretary in the Radiology Department, while attending the Diagnostic Imaging Program at Fort Hays State University. She wored part-time in x-ray and CT for several years at HaysMed while working full-time in imaging at Russell Regional Hospital. "In 2008, I accepted a full time job at Hays Med where I provided imaging services for the past 15 years," she said. "I also cross-trained in the Cardiac Cath Lab for two years, performing interventional procedures with the cardiologists."

#### Pavlu Joins Heart of Kansas at Larned as a Nurse Practicioner

Shelly Pavlu's background in rural healthcare was the forerunner to her new position at Heart of Kansas Family Health Care in Larned where she cares for patients as a nurse practitioner. Pavlu recently started seeing patients of all ages in her family-medicine practice at 522 Broadway. "When I was first introduced to Heart of Kansas, I noticed right away that several staff members have been here for quite some time," Pavlu said. "Longevity of service is something that I value."

Prior to her college days, Pavlu was a certified nurse's aide and certified medication aide. She also became an EMT and volunteers for the local Emergency Medical Services. "Throughout my nursing career, I worked mainly in rural healthcare as a floor nurse but was in public health for a decade," Pavlu said. "I have truly worked in all aspects of nursing." She was previously employed by The University of Kansas Health System St. Rose Campus as a provider in family medicine and Convenient Care.


