### **New MEDITECH EMR system offers** Patient Portal, automatic reminders

The new electronic medical record (EMR) system at Pawnee Valley Medical Associates (PVMA) provides for more coordinated care and improved communication.

MEDITECH is the same EMR system in place at Pawnee Valley Community Hospital and HaysMed.

"This high-quality system changes everything for our patients," said Jewel Davis, clinic office manager. "All departments at Pawnee Valley Community Hospital and HaysMed have patient medical information instantly."

For example, if a clinic patient **Jewel Davis** visits the Emergency Department at one of these hospitals, medical records are available to the provider.

"This enhances patient care tremendously," Davis noted. "Medical history is a great resource when deciding on a treatment plan."

In addition, "when patients leave our clinic, they have access to a discharge summary that lists upcoming appointments, orders for after-care and educational information from their providers," Davis outlined.

The convenience of readily available medical records isn't the only plus to this new system: patients also have access to new services.

"Patients can now sign up for our Patient Portal, which gives easy access to all their medical records, including lab tests, medical imaging, prescriptions, vaccinations, provider referrals and more in one convenient location," Davis noted. "When you check in for your next appointment, let the front office know if you'd like to participate."

Patients also have access to a new automatic service that reminds them of upcoming clinic appointments. They are contacted by phone and/or text a few days before.

> "This new EMR system is a big plus for our providers too," Davis said. "They can have their patients' medical records at their fingertips."

Davis appreciates everyone at the clinic and hospitals who contributed to this project.

"We are fortunate to have a large support team, with years of MEDITECH experience," she

commented. "PVMA has made an enormous effort to keep up with the latest technology, with the support of Pawnee Valley Community Hospital and HaysMed.

"This new EMR system is just another illustration of our devotion and commitment to the local community."

Melanie Urban, PVCH administrator, noted "the transition of our family-medicine clinic to MEDITECH is a significant milestone for our organization because it builds on our commitment to patient safety and patient engagement.

While a progressive medical facility focuses on bringing the latest and greatest to their patients, it is inevitable to be faced with "growing pains". Clara Barton Medical Clinic – Great Bend has been a part of the Great Bend community for the past seven years, but as they continued to grow and expand services, they quickly outgrew their existing space. In efforts to provide the necessary square footage and increase efficiency for both recent and upcoming additions, Clara Barton recently opened their new Great Bend clinic location at 906 McKinley Street.

Previously located in Jackson Square, Clara Barton's Great Bend Clinic was a mere 2,758 square feet, housing just five exam rooms and one procedure room.

"The lack of space made it difficult for more than one provider to operate out of our Jackson Square location at one time, nor did it allow us the ability to grow," said Shayla Cook, Clinic Nurse Manager. "Not only does our new space allow us the ability for multiple providers to work out of the facility at one time, but we are now able to offer more services to our patients

as well as providing a more comfortable and convenient experience."

Clara Barton's new rural health clinic on McKinley Street opened on April 26th and boasts 10,000 square feet, housing 18 exam rooms, and 2 procedure rooms.

"In addition to our family practice providers, our surgeons are also able to see patients out of our new Great Bend Clinic location, offering preand post-operative appointments, preventative screenings, and minor procedures," said Cook. "While we are

not a surgery center, the added space allows our surgeons to perform a variety of procedures that don't require general anesthesia, such as

breast biopsies and vasectomies."

Snell, PA-C, Taylor Bieberle, PA-C, or Brandi Lowe, PA-C. In addition, General Surgeons Dr. P.J. Stiles, Dr. Jeremy Howes, Dr. Roxanne Stiles, and Pediatrician Dr. Kayla Johnson also see patients at the new clinic.

> Another aspect that often attracts patients to Clara Barton is the familiar faces they see during medical appointments.

"Many of our providers and clinic staff are homegrown individuals who have returned to their roots," Cook explained. "They provide care and treatment to the people who helped raise them and shape them to be the compassionate healthcare providers they are today. At Clara Barton our doctors, physician's assistants, and entire clinical care team work extremely well together, always putting the needs of their patients

first."

All three of Clara Barton's clinics are certified Patient-Centered Medical Homes, which also assists in building stronger

relationships between patients and providers.

Because local, quality healthcare is so important, the benefits of the services offered through Clara

Barton directly impact members throughout the community. Through partnering with several local organizations, Clara Barton continues to emphasize community involvement and wellbeing. The Great Bend Clinic also has a new outdoor walking trail open for public use, aimed at encouraging long-lasting and sustainable healthy lifestyles.

I look forward to seeing her develop within our medical community and watching those collaborations grow internally."

### Specialists bring experience to The Center, enhance services

Scot Yarnell and Jill Hulse, native Kansans, were eager to accept positions at The Center for Counseling & Consultation because they believe they can satisfy local needs that continue to grow.

Yarnell is a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner, while Hulse is a family practitioner studying to add (PMH NP) to her credentials.

This specialty addresses psychiatric illnesses for outpatients and inpatients.

"Since we are both family practitioners, we have the knowledge to differentiate between physical and mental-health issues," Yarnell said.

"I worked in emergency rooms and corrections facilities, and learned that sometimes patients have more of a psychiatric need than a physical need."

While Yarnell and Hulse treat a variety of

illnesses and conditions, they are especially interested in substance-use disorders.

"This is really big," Yarnell commented. "The need for these services is definitely here"

Statistically, he noted, 40 percent of people with an addiction have a mental illness independent of that addiction.

"Our experience guides us to offer services specific to each patient," Yarnell noted. "If a patient is motivated, we can help. I always say 'don't give up on me and I won't give up on you."

Hulse noted that she and Yarnell were searching for a smaller community in rural Kansas to establish their practices.

"We were living in Wichita and learned these positions became available," she said. "We are happy to be in a place that

with the PVCH Foundation Gala. Lori is really looking forward to working with the United Way.



### CHS moves to new location at Sunflower Diversified Services

The finishing touches are being wrapped up at the new Community Habilitation Services (CHS) location at Sunflower Diversified Services, a non-profit agency that serves people with special needs.

Previously, CHS was housed at the former Sunflower facility, 1521 K-96. Now, thanks to a major remodeling job, its new home is at Sunflower's main location, 8823 4th St.

"This has been a gradual process over a period of several months," said John Lichter, Sunflower director of facilities management. "It has been well worth it because of all the benefits to everyone involved.

"For example, if a client needs to check in with Sunflower's medical personnel, it can be done in a minute or two instead of a staff member driving to another location. Our General Public Transportation vehicles are right here too. This also saves time and fuel expenses."

In addition, there are now two dining areas. "Lunchtime is much more comfortable for everyone," Lichter noted. "It had been a little crowded with just one dining area."

Sunflower's maintenance team handled

most of the work in-house.

"Randy Greathouse and Willie Ayers did a great job on this project," Lichter said. "They deserve a lot of credit for creating an efficient and welcoming environment. It has been good for client and staff morale."

Local subcontractors took care of the wiring, plumbing and flooring. Those involved were Mac-Clet Electrical, ComfortPro and Kern Floor Service.

The project entailed new walls, partitions and painting in more than a third of the buildina.

The cost was approximately \$40,000; First Christian Church purchased the K-96 building from Sunflower.

CHS includes physical and other therapies, cooking classes, outdoor and retirement activities, and support services.

Shelby Zuniga, Sunflower interim executive director, said "John and his crew never let us down. These guys go above and beyond on every project and this was no exception.

"The team transformed under-utilized space and turned every square foot into usable areas to support our clients. This allows more

convenient service options in a fresh and newly updated space. It also allows staff to better collaborate with one another on behalf of clients."

Sunflower serves infants, toddlers and adults in Barton, Pawnee, Rice, Rush and Stafford counties. It is in its 57th year.

has so many resources; we are definitely going to use them.

"For example, The Center has professional and compassionate therapists, case managers and a great support staff at its four locations. We are quite impressed with everyone here."

When they lived in Wichita, they would see patients who traveled for several hours for appointments.

"But we know there are others who didn't come because of a lack of transportation or they couldn't take a day off work,' Hulse said. "We hope to help fill this gap in central and western Kansas."

Hulse and Yarnell see patients age 6 and older at the Great Bend location, 5815 Broadway. They also have tele-health capabilities for The Center's service area of Barton, Pawnee, Rice and Stafford counties.

Yarnell is from a farming background at Buffalo in southeast Kansas; Hulse is a Lindsborg native. They have rented a house in Great Bend.

Their backgrounds include

experience in emergency and acute care, pediatrics, geriatrics, family medicine, psychiatry and addiction.


