# **Assisted-Living Suites Almost Complete At Cherry Village**



Even though she enjoys interacting with other people, Ramsey noted she highly values her privacy too. "I love to read, which is why privacy is important to me," she explained. "I am certainly not a recluse but I do like to be alone to enjoy my books. I can have that privacy here at Cherry Village." She is also a friend with Jake, the Cherry Village conure parrot. "Jake is kind of interesting," Ramsey noted. "He chose me. I talk with him and take him out of his cage. He walks around on me."

Pam Lewis, Cherry Village administrator, said Ramsey's experience in assisted living demonstrates how residents can strike the right balance in their lives. The level of daily assisted-living care varies. Options include housekeeping, medication administration and bathing assistance. Registered and licensed practical nurses that are assigned only to assisted living are available 24/7. In addition, Cherry Village residents who need physical, occupational or speech therapy don't have to leave the building.


